He has dedicated countless hours of research for investigations best practices.

Prior to working in law enforcement, Jayme spent five years as a high school science teacher. He obtained his Bachelor of Science and Education and later obtained his Master of Science in Biology from the University of Nebraska-Kearney. He currently holds an Idaho POST advanced certificate and has been an Idaho POST certified instructor since 2017.

Jayme is a subject matter expert in bloodstain pattern analysis. The process for international recognition includes a grueling series of coursework, proficiency testing, and mentorship requirements.
